Ordinance No. 22.

Amending Ordinance No. 12, entitled "Ordinance No.12, regulating and defining sidewalks in the City of Wathena, the proceedings in relation to constructing, repairing, and maintaining the same, and regulating the building, construction and repairing of such sidewalks by lot owners and by the city."

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Wathena:

Section 1 That section twelve (12) of ordinance Number twelve (12) shall read as follows: Sec. 12. That sidewalks of the fourth class shall be four feet wide, and shall be made of oak, cypress, pine, or such other lumber as the council may direct, of boards of the dimension of two by twelve inches, of such length as may be convenient, but not less than ten feet, to be laid length wise, on goo oak stringers, of not less than two by four inches, said stringers to be not more than four feet apart.

Section 2. That section thirteen (13) of ordinance number twelve (12) shall read as follows: Sect. 13. That sidewalks of the fifth class shall be three feet wide, and shall in all other respects be of the same material and construction as sidewalks of the fourth class.

Section 3. That section fourteen (14) of ordinance number twelve (12) shall read as follows: Sec 14. That in all sidewalks made of wood the boards shall be laid as snugly together as possible, and the space between the boards shall in no case be over one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ inch.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the Mayor and publication in The Wathena Republican and the Wathena Times.
