## Ordinance No. 6.

For Granting Cereal Business and Other Licenses. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Wathena:

Section 1. That no persons or co-partnership of persons shall engage in any of the following occupations; professions, or lines of business in this City to-wit: auctioneers, contractors, druggists, hawkers, peddlers, brokers, pawnbrokers, merchants of all kinds, grocers, confectioners, restaurants, butchers, taverns, public boarding houses, dramshops, saloons, liquor sellers, billard tables, bowling alleys, drays, hacks, carriages, omnibusses, carts, wagons and other vehicles used in the City for pay, lumber dealers, furniture dealers, saddle or harness dealers, stationers, jewelers livery stable keepers, real-estate agents, attorneys at law and physicians residing in the City, express companies or agencies, telegraph companies or agencies, shows, theatres, and all kinds of exhibitions for pay, without first obtaining a license therefor, as provided in this and other ordinances of this City; nor shall any one keep or harbor a dog or slut, without a license therefor. Provided, that nothing in this ordinance shall be so construed as to prevent the giving of any exhibition without license therefor, the net proceeds of which shall be exclusively devoted to any religious charitable, literary or scientific purpose; not to prevent the selling of fresh fish, vegetables, fruit or game, by the producor or captor.

Section 2. The license for circuses shall be at the rate of twenty dollars per day; peddlers, at the rate of one dollar and fifty cents per day; gift enterprises, at the rate of five dollars; exhibitions of all kinds, except circuses, literary, scientific and religious, as herein excepted, three dollars per day; auctioneers three dollars per day, or if by the month or year, at the rate of one hundred dollars per year; scales, where charges are made for weighing, five dollars per year; and all other licenses, at the rate of ten dollars per year, except as the Council may otherwise order.

Section 3. All licenses shall expire on the 1st day of May, next succeeding the time of taking out the same, except such as may be taken for a shorter time, as herein provided.

Section 4. All licenses that may be issued under any ordinance of this City shall be subject to the ordinances and regulations which may be in force at the time of issuing the same, or which may be subsequently made by the City Council.

Section 5. No license grnated under any ordinance of this City, shall be assignable or transferable, without permission of the Mayor and Council nor shall such license authorize any person to do business, or act under it except the person named therein, or at more than one place, at the same time.

Section 6. All licenses shall be signed by the Mayor and City Clerk, and countersigned by the Treasurer, and the Clerk shall affix the official seal of the City thereto, and shall be, as nearly as may be in the following form:

Section 7. The City Clerk is hereby authorized to grant all **such** licenses to any persons or person applying therefor, upon said applicant or applicants presenting to him the receipt of the Treasurer of the City for the amount of the license he is to obtain, and the additional sum of fifty cents as the Clerk's fee for issuing such license; Provided, That the fee of the Clerk shall be twenty-five cents for issuing licenses to peddlers and hawkers, when for but one way; fifty cents for gift enterprises and concerts; and one dollar for circuses.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in pamphlet form.
