

Ordinance No. 63

Ordinance compelling all Railway Companies to maintain and operate a suitable light at their railway crossing on St. Joseph Street.

Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Wathena that all Railway Companies now or hereafter operating through the City limits of Wathena is hereby compelled to maintain at their Railway crossings crossing St. Joseph street, a suitable light of not less than 80 candle power every day from on hour after the sun sets until 12 o'clock midnight.

Sec. 2. In the failure of any Railway Company now or hereafter operating through the City limits of Wathena to comply with the above section of this ordinance, they shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$5.00 or more than \$50.00 for each offence and every night they fail to comply with the first section of this ordinance, shall be deemed an offence.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after its passage by the City Council and its publication in The Wathena Republican.
